A word from the CEO

Change work that has had results.

Profits for the fourth quarter amounted to SEK 18.0 million (-3.7), which is the highest quarterly result thus far in Prevas' history. The operating margin landed at 8.4 percent (-1.8) and is a step in the right direction. Sales increased by 1 percent. A modest increase but still a positive development. This is also fully in line with our strategy for 2019, to prioritize earnings before growth. The board recommends a dividend for 2019 of SEK 0.75 per share. The recommendation is based on the improved operating profit and the positive trend we are seeing in development of the company.

The reason for the improved results in the final quarter is found in a combination of several factors. These include reduced costs, sales success, increased ability to run turnkey delivery assignments, high productivity in the organization and great commitment on the part of our employees.

Increased opportunities to do good

It is especially rewarding that the financial results are going in the right direction even during the final quarter of the year, a period that has been historically weak for Prevas. Good results create security for employees, customers and owners, and give us as more latitude in implementing investments. It also gives us more muscle and opportunities to actively develop what we are most passionate about – together with customers and partners, creating technological advances that make things better for people, planet and the economy.

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The journey is ongoing

Is the journey over? No. The past year has been marked by change, at the same time as the focus has been on improving profitability. Work with change is a long-term thing and the plan now is very much about maintaining what we've already accomplished and continuing our efforts. Not the least, the economic outlook means that focus is needed to secure an adequate profit, while at the same time strengthening our good market position further and continuing to build values for the future.

Need for sustainable solutions

There are several macro signs of a deteriorating business cycle, while at the same time there is a tremendous need

for both innovative product development and sustainable production development. We believe that there is a substantial need, in the future as well, of both consulting and implementation of solutions with the complex technology heights that Prevas offers. There are several trends, both in technology as well as in society, that are powerful in themselves and that interact and create impetus for change. A strong trend is the increased focus on sustainability, and it is truly rewarding to see that Prevas contributes to lower energy use in industry, more efficient solar and wind power, increased safety and better health for mankind.

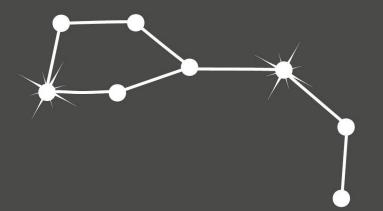

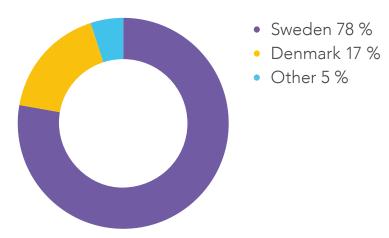
New technology and sustainability - important for the engineering industry

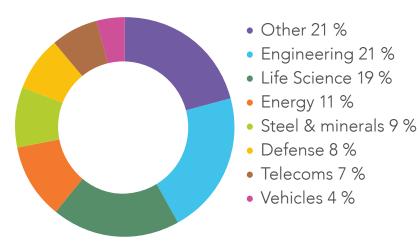
The largest customers, 2019

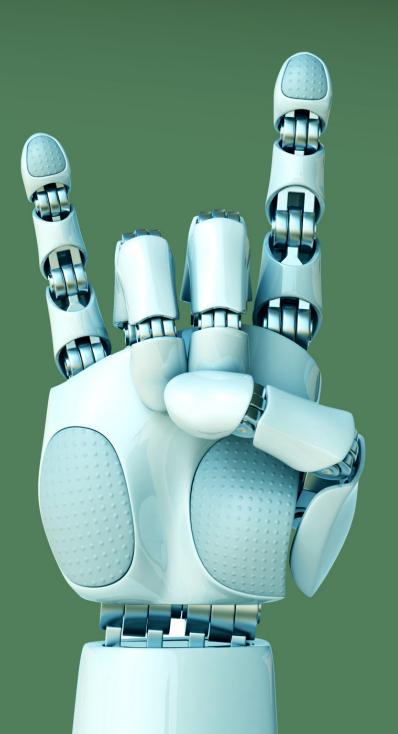

Important events during the period

Prevas automates Norway

Prevas has received a new major automation order for a Norwegian company within the automotive industry. To achieve increased production capacity and flexibility, four new production lines are being built. Prevas has been given the full assignment, which covers project management, design, manufacture, installation, programming and commissioning of the equipment.

• Prevas sponsors SmiLe Incubator

The SmiLe incubator helps entrepreneurs and startup companies within life science to develop and commercialize their products and services. Prevas is a gold sponsor of SmiLe Incubator and will guide the incubator companies through the jungle of regulations and quality requirements in fields such as medicines, diagnostic, e-health and medical technology.

• Prevas supports entrepreneurs within e-health

Health2B is an e-health-accelerator that gives the entrepreneurs the possibility of developing their ideas for successful companies. Seven companies that develop connected products and services for more effective healthcare have been selected from 50 applicants from around the world. These companies will have the opportunity to develop their business concepts with support from a team of experts and advisors, of which Prevas are one, for a period of three months.

• Focus on sustainable production

Prevas and Recab are both established suppliers within Swedish industry and have now chosen to start a non-dependent collaboration around sustainable production with the purpose of being able to offer complete solutions that make it easier for organizations that take the next step of the digitalization journey.

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Financial Information, group

Turnover

October - December

Net turnover amounted to 213.8 MSEK (211.8) an increase of 1 percent. The number of working days amounted to 62 (62). Net turnover per employee amounted to 391 TSEK (384).

January - December

Net turnover amounted to 796.4 MSEK (771.0) an increase of 3 percent. The number of working days amounted to 250 (250). Net turnover per employee amounted to 1,478 TSEK (1,457).

Earnings

October - December

Operating profit/loss EBIT amounted to 18.0 MSEK (-3.7), which gives an operating margin of 8.4 percent (-1.8). Profit before depreciation/amortization and write downs EBITDA amounted to 25.9 MSEK (-2.1) which gives profit margin before depreciation/amortization and write downs of 12.1 percent (-1.0). EBITDA has been affected by the implementation of IFRS 16, see page 14. Profits after tax amounted to 12.5 MSEK (-3.6). Operations have seen continued positive development in consultancy utilization and project operations.

January - December

Operating profit/loss EBIT amounted to 47.0 MSEK (9.5),

which gives an operating margin of 5.9 percent (1.2). Profit before depreciation/amortization and write downs EBITDA amounted to 75.2 MSEK (16.3) which gives profit margin before depreciation/amortization and write downs of 9.4 percent (2.1). EBITDA has been affected by the implementation of IFRS 16, see page 14. Profits after tax amounted to 32.4 MSEK (5.6).

Cash flow, liquid funds and financing

The cash flow from ongoing operations for the year amounted to 58.7 MSEK (18.3). Liquid funds at year end amounted to 52.2 MSEK (21.8) of which an unused overdraft facility for 51.3 MSEK (21.1). It is the judgment of the Board that Prevas has a financing situation appropriate for the company's future planning.

Financial position

Equity at period end amounted to 188.6 MSEK (156.6), which gives an equity ratio of 47 percent (42). Equity per share amounted to 18.49 SEK (15.22).

Employees

The average number of employees during the year amounted to 539 (529), of which 418 (410) were in Sweden, 82 (80) in Denmark, 17 (15) in Other segments and 22 (24) were central. The number of employees at period end amounted to 578 (582) of which the proportion who were women was 13 percent.

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Investments

During the year, the group's investment in assets amounted to 2.8 MSEK (3.0), of which 2.0 MSEK (1.7) covered machinery and inventory and 0.8 MSEK (1.3) product development and intangible assets. Other investments refers to rights-of-use assets regarding IFRS16 that saw a net increase of 45 MSEK as a consequence of new accounting regulations.

Operational strength key ratios, projects in time

Customer satisfaction, delivery precision and warranty work are continuously metered as part of the company's certified quality system. Since starting in 1985 Prevas has had a very high number of satisfied customers and unique high quality figures regarding delivery precision and warranty. Prevas' customer satisfaction rating has increased during the quarter and has risen to 8.6 (scale of 1 to 10). This combined with a large part of our deliveries being on time and of the correct quality, means that Prevas is rated highly by customers.

The Parent Company

October - December

Turnover amounted to 150.4 MSEK (156.5) and the result after financial items amounted to 11.3 MSEK (-1.2). Profits after tax amounted to 6.1 MSEK (-1.2).

January - December

Turnover amounted to 561.8 MSEK (556.9) and the result after financial items amounted to 22.6 MSEK (-1.3). During the year a fusion was implemented regarding Psiam AB that resulted in a negative fusion differential of 6.5 MSEK.

Risks and uncertainty factors

Prevas operates in very competitive and changeable market. This places great demands on risk management, or the point of view that Prevas focuses on – risk optimizing. Risk is involved in every operation and the objective is always to reduce risk so that it has as little impact as possible. However, Prevas takes the view that each risk also creates new opportunities and drives change. Based on this perspective, Prevas has integrated risk management into all aspects of our operations, with a special focus within the areas of marketing, delivery and operational management. The foundation of managing risk is the company's management system, which ensures that the work with risk management is carried out in a systematic and efficient way. Prevas works continuously with risk evaluation in all stages from business development to delivery. From that, new opportunities are identified and if necessary risk minimizing actions are implemented. Examples of operational and market related risks are; competition and pricing pressure, negative development at our customers, bankruptcy risks and exchange and interest rate risk.

It is Prevas' judgment that generally the risks have increased slightly during the last few years but that the fourth quarter in 2019 has not lead to any increased exposure to risk. Another risk is the competition for qualified employees, the risk of which has continued to increase during 2019. From Prevas' position as market leader within certain areas, it is important to attract and recruit the best possible people. Given the good labor market, the difficulty in maintaining the level of expertise is something that may affect Prevas in the future. More information about Prevas' risks and the management of



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them can be read in the Annual report for 2018, page 31. It is the company's evaluation that the risks are the same as for the parent company.

Transactions with affiliated bodies

Any transactions of this type are reported in the annual report 2018 under note 25 and largely attributable to purchases and sales between companies within the group. Transactions occur under market conditions.

Accounting principles

This interim report has been prepared in accordance with IAS 34 Interim reports. The group report has been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards, IFRS, as adopted by the EU, and where relevant Swedish legislation regarding annual reports. The parent company accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Annual Accounts Act and recommendation RFR 2 Accounts for legal entities.

The group applies the IFRS 16 Leasing agreement from January 1st 2019. The parent company does not apply IFRS 16 in accordance with the exceptions stated in RFR 2. The description of IFRS 16 and the effects of the transition to this standard are given alongside the calculations in summary. The standard means that leasing agreements are reported in the balance sheet as rights of use and for Prevas it primarily concerns rental contracts and leased cars, as well as reporting a lease liability.

The right of use assets are initially valued at acquisition value, which consists of the lease liability's original value with the addition of lease fees paid before or after the introduction date. Initially the leasing debt was valued at the present value of the future leasing fees which

had not been paid at the start date. The lease fees are discounted by the lease agreement's implicit interest rate. If this interest rate cannot be easily set, the group's marginal borrowing rate is used. The standard ignores low value contracts shorter than 12 months duration.

At the transition, Prevas opted for a relief rule that means that the comparative figures are not recalculated. The right of use assets value were set at January 1st to the lease liability's discounted present value with an addition for prepaid fees. Leasing debts are discounted at an average interest rate of 2 % for rental agreements and 5 % for car leasing. Leasing cars acquired before January 1 2019 and reported in accordance with IAS17 have been reclassified during the year from material assets to rights of use assets. The total value of all rights of use assets at the beginning of the year was 50.9 MSEK, of which 12 MSEK was reclassification.

Financial instruments

Reported value of liquid funds, account receivables, generated but unbilled income, interest bearing liabilities and suppliers' liabilities are considered to make up an approximation of the actual value of these receivables and liabilities.

Proposed dividend

The Board proposes to the Annual General Meeting that a dividend be issued of 0.75 SEK/share (0).
